
Wider Achievement

Healthy Schools

This is a subject close to many hearts and all schools are being asked to review their practices around physical activity and healthy eating in particular, in line with Scottish Government advice and guidelines. As you may know we discourage parents from sending in birthday cakes or treats and if they have come in we issue these at the end of the day for parents to then choose whether / when their child can have them. As of the start of next session we are asking parents not to send in any treats to issue to classes for any occasion and we shall also not be issuing any treats in school during the school day in order to promote a consistent message around healthy eating.

P6/7 and P4/5 Girls Football 2022/2023

As Mr Diffley is not with us next session, we are looking for parent helpers to help with training sessions after school each week for one hour and to help with supporting the team at football games on Saturday mornings. Across the year there is approx. 12-15 games which we would need help with from August- March and any cup games which we qualify for in the summer term.

The role would include helping organising the team to play, bringing kit with you for the players and liaising with the opposite team to confirm where the match is played. Most games start at 9.30am so it would be a commitment from 9.15-11am on a Saturday morning when we have a fixture.

School Improvement: plans for next session

Many thanks to those who responded to our survey regarding pupil equity funding, school improvement and parent consultations. We had 16 responses with the majority favouring two face-face parent consultations and these will be organised for November and April/May. Further detail will be shared at the PFC AGM in September but common themes were:

To improve—more art/music/ outdoor learning, stretching pupils more and playground improvements.

Things going well—pastoral care, equity, support for families, leadership, appreciation of all staff.

In relation to pupil equity funding wellbeing interventions, literacy and numeracy interventions and family support were all top priorities for parents and so we will have our new pupil support officer to help with wellbeing and family support and Mrs Krchnak will also be supporting pupils in small groups next year too as well as Mrs Wightman.

We are looking forward to establishing partnerships with Friends of Gayfield Square and Friends of Hopetoun Crescent Gardens to plan more outdoor learning and staff will be looking at music and art provision across the school when we return next session. We will also be continuing our work to improve writing, digital technologies and equalities/equity.

Finally, this past academic year, and the one before, and possibly the one that will come after, have been exhausting on so many levels. In all our walks of life we've had staffing challenges, illness on top of covid and so much disruption to family events and gatherings and I know many are still grieving for loved ones. We're maybe only at the threshold of understanding what we have all been through— so thank you as always for your support and understanding.
