### **School Attendance**


## 'Every Day Counts' 'Every Minute Counts'

As indicated in the January newsletter, improving school attendance is a national and local priority. Attendance at school is a key factor in children and young people's attainment, well-being and future life opportunities and every day counts and every minute counts. The more time children spend in school, the better they are likely to do in terms of learning and overall achievement: *UNCRC Article 28: the right to an education* and *Article 29: the right to let your talents shine.* 

Ideally all pupils will have attendance of 95% or above. The graphics below illustrate the impact of missed days and missed minutes. Staff in school may be in touch to discuss your child's attendance if it falls below 90% and particularly if it falls below 85%. This is also when the Education Wellbeing Service may become involved. Parents and Carers will also now know that a text message is sent when a child is late. All pupils should be in their class as soon after the door is opened at 0845. They are marked late if they are not in class by 0855 and they will already have missed instructions for the start of the day's task and any information about the day. Some of our classes begin P.E. at the very start of the day too. Some pupils may benefit from a slightly later, 'soft start' and this is arranged in discussion with school. It is really important that you let us know if your child is going to be absent as we need to know they are safe. Please do come and speak to us if you need any help or support.
